Pastoral Pondering

THIS JESUS

Lorraine and I have been spending wonderful time each day trying to ponder *as one,* a passage of scripture. Just in this short time it has been an extreme challenge and a wonderful blessing all at once. Each day we read a chapter and try to distill it into one or two sentences. That is challenging for any one mind. Try agreeing on it with two minds. I liken it to wallpapering which I consider to be the extreme test of marital union. As if the concept isn't challenging enough, we decided to walk through Hebrews. A "simple book"??

So far we have had a great time. We have learned that:

- God now speaks to us directly through His Son
- Who is higher than the angels but can sympathize with us because He suffered when tempted.
- He is worthy of more glory than Moses and so deserving of all our attention/obedience which can only lead to true Rest
- This *rest* is not the rest of defeating toil/enemies like Joshua did, but the rest found in drawing near the throne of grace and receiving mercy and grace in time of need.
- We do this by turning from the elemental things of faith and holding fast to our confession that "This Jesus" is the Everlasting, High Priest and King of Peace from an order that was and is before the Promise of the Law.
- His ministry is the real ministry, of which the ministry of all our ages is only a shadow, and His new covenant is before the Law was.
- This is His new covenant, which was before Abraham. (Hebrews 8:10)
 "I will put my laws into their minds,
 and write them on their hearts,
 and I will be their God,
 and they shall be my people."

So far that is all we have. But it makes me want to stop and just think about it.

We picked a book at random, and just a couple days and a couple moments and yet, wow! Who is this Jesus? When you condense it like that it is mind blowing. Knowing this, our job is to rest in this. How can you rest in something this huge? Our salvation, our purpose, our very existence hangs on the concept of "This Jesus". Then we are to rest in that! The stakes seem so high. It is hard to rest in something when our ability to fathom it is so deficient and the cost for getting it wrong seems so dire.

But that is the point. Thanks be to God that our existence, purpose, and salvation don't hang on *our* ability to understand and apply anything. They hang on The cross, or more correctly on Him who hung on the cross.

As I thought about who <u>this Jesus</u> that we worship is, I found an interesting "coincidence". I thought I might share it.

I looked up the phrase "This Jesus" in the ESV, and where "this" is used as an adjective for Jesus, it gives just 8 distinct verses from two separate books that read in order tell a story so I thought I would share it. Here they are. (They are direct quotes so please forgive the syntactic irregularities.)

"They said, 'Is not this Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? How does he now say, 'I have come down from heaven?" (John 6:42)

"Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into heaven? <u>This Jesus</u>, who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven." (Acts 1:11)

"<u>This Jesus</u>, delivered up according to the definite plan and foreknowledge of God, you crucified and killed by the hands of lawless men." (Acts 2:23)

"This Jesus God raised up, and of that we all are witnesses." (Acts 2:32)

"Let all the house of Israel therefore know for certain that God has made him both Lord and Christ, this Jesus whom you crucified." (Acts 2:36)

"<u>This Jesus</u> is the stone that was rejected by you, the builders, which has become the cornerstone." (Acts 4:11)

"...for we have heard him say that this Jesus of Nazareth will destroy this place and will change the customs that Moses delivered to us." (Acts 6:14)

"Explaining and proving that it was necessary for the Christ to suffer and to rise from the dead, and saying, "This Jesus, whom I proclaim to you, is the Christ." (Acts 17:3)

Who is this Jesus, but the son of God. To Him alone be the glory.


