## **Pastoral Ponderings**

Growing up, if I was asked, "What are your favorite Bible verses?" I would have quickly answered, "Matthew 28:18-20" our Savior's final earthly words and the exclamation point of the book of Matthew.

"And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

For a passage that I had memorized at a young age, the phrase "teaching them to observe" had slipped by me too easily for over 2 score and 3 years (don't calculate that). Let's look a bit more closely at those words.

What exactly does "teaching them to observe" mean?

Typically, when we read this text, we conclude that Jesus was commanding his disciples to tell people to obey His commands. We readily surmise, after all Jesus had done (spelled out in the rest of the book of Matthew), now His disciples were called to tell people to obey what He had said – In short, 'Obey... Do this... Don't do that.'

Though we want people to obey Him, this conclusion really misses the point of Jesus' words. Is Christianity meant to be a movement characterized by a list of does and don'ts? If so, Christianity sounds a lot like every other religion under heaven.

The Old Testament is filled with the commands of our Savior. In fact, every Godgiven command in the Old (and New) Testament (starting in the garden of Eden) — was given by the Lord. Jesus Christ is the Word of God — the means by which the commands have been given to us from God. When Moses held in his hands the ten "words" (which we westerners translate "commands"), it was Jesus who gave us those words/commands. When He told Moses, "take off your sandals," he was beholding Jesus' command.

So, when Jesus was giving His final earthly instructions, was He merely saying – once again, "Tell people to obey me!"? was that his final word to His disciples? Hey! Sinner – Obey!

Sadly, this has become the game plan for many organizations. It's attractive because it's simple and clear-cut: Just educate people and they will become holy.

What finally occurred to me, was that Jesus was not redundantly telling people to obey. No. Jesus was sending His disciples out in order to teach people *how* to obey.

This is the unique message of Christianity. This is what Christ does. He proclaims the key for us to *actually* obey. For all of history (except for two early chapters) mankind has not known *how* to obey the Lord. Until we knew Jesus, we did not have the key.

Did you notice what Jesus sends them out with? When He calls the disciples to go forth – He does so while giving them Himself, "Behold! IAM with you always, to the end of the age." They go forth with Christ and are called to proclaim what Christ has done.

At the final exclamation point in the book of Matthew, Jesus expects that we bring the message of the life, death and resurrection of Himself to the world (which are the contents of the book that these words conclude). And as we do that, we must recognize that Jesus is with us and in us proclaiming His message to a lost world.

Thus, it is Christ (and His life) who is the key to our obedience (and our proclamation of it). *He* is the one who has "all authority" to transform sinners into obedient children. And if we don't proclaim *Christ*, there is no hope – no matter how earnestly we call people to obey.

You want to know how to finally obey – Look and cling to Jesus.
