Pastoral Pondering

WHICH CAME FIRST? THE CHICKEN OR THE EGG?

We know from the creation account in the Bible that God created the birds before any bird ever laid an egg. We also know from the dictionary that "chicken" comes before "egg." (Think about it for a few seconds.)

There is an interesting "which came first" question in the Bible—in the book of Genesis.

In Genesis 15:1 God spoke to Abram with encouraging words. He said, "Fear not, Abram, I am your shield; your reward shall be very great." Abram replied in verse 2, "O Lord GOD, what will you give me, for I continue childless." This reply is surprising because it is a non sequitur. God was letting Abram know what He thought of him and how he would fit into His plan for the world. Why would Abram reply to God's encouragement in such an ungrateful unrelated manner? It does not make sense.

One reason for Abram's answer is that it reveals what was in the forefront of Abram's mind. It was a great concern to him that he did not have a son. He wanted someone to receive the great blessings God had promised him. He had already seen significant material blessings. Those blessings required him to separate from his nephew Lot due to the vast herds and flocks they both had. Abram was getting older and there was no son to inherit this wealth. As a result, he voiced his concern to the Lord. He even went on to say it was God's fault in verse 3, "Behold, you have given me no offspring."

The Lord did not react to Abram like my mother reacted to me once: "Watch your tongue, young man!" (Well, maybe it was more than once.) Of course, Abram was far beyond being a "young man" and his concern about the lack of a son was not frivolous. Indeed, God had promised Abram that He would make him a great nation. One elderly, childless couple was hardly "a great nation."

The Lord's response in verse 4 was exactly what Abram needed to hear: "*Your very own son shall be your heir*." It was years before that son was born, but the New Testament tells us something amazing about Abram as he waited through those long years.

He did not weaken in faith when he considered his own body, which was as good as dead (since he was about a hundred years old), or when he considered the barrenness of Sarah's womb. No unbelief made him waver concerning the promise of God, but he grew strong in his faith as he

gave glory to God, fully convinced that God was able to do what He had promised. (Romans 4:19-21, ESV)

Now what about that "which came first" question? Whose idea was it for Abram to have a son? Abram mentioned it first. The Lord responded to him immediately with the news that Abram would father a son. The Lord had first promised that Abram would become a great nation, and for that to happen, there would need to be a son.

Even though Abram is the first to mention a son in this passage, it was God's idea and plan. God used Abram's natural desire to have a son to lead Abram to speak of the need of a son. Abram was a man of faith who walked with the Lord. His thoughts were influenced by the Lord's thoughts even though he thought the Lord might have forgotten that important detail.

Abram only had his eyes on one son. Little did he know that one of his sons, many generations later, would be the Savior of the world!

May we be so in-tune with the Holy Spirit that we follow the unintentional example of Abram and think God's thoughts.


