LIFE IS SHORT, DEATH IS SURE, SIN IS THE CAUSE AND JESUS IS THE CURE

"For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them."

Ephesians 2:10

I recently came across a blog posting "Life is short, Death is sure, Sin is the cause and Jesus is the cure!". This caused me to reflect on recent news I received that my old friend and former surgeon at Osceola, Dr. Richard Strate, had passed away at the age of 89. He was the most talented and gifted surgeon I've ever had the personal satisfaction of knowing. He served in Vietnam and, as a result, was used to working with less given any condition. After the war he returned home and started the Burn Center at what is now Region's Hospital, which has treated thousands of people. Later in his career he found his way to Osceola Medical Center at the same time I started, way back in 1993. I spent the next 15 years working with him. He came from an era where decisions were based on examination and experience rather than expensive labs and CAT scans. To this day I reflect with awe on the care and expertise he provided to Osceola. I am still convinced he could fix anyone with a Leatherman and duct tape if that was all he had. Upon hearing the news of his passing, I was saddened to know that the world had lost an incredibly talented surgeon who had impacted thousands of people over his lifetime. What an earthly legacy to leave behind!

The thought of leaving a legacy never really entered my mind while I was working, but retirement and aging begged the question of "what difference did I make?" I spent what seemed like a lifetime going through school with the goal of eventually becoming a doctor, and suddenly after almost 30 years I packed up my two medical books, my medical diploma and took my stethoscope and went home. I must admit that I felt a little lost like a part of my identity was removed. Suddenly I found myself with much time on my hands to reflect on who I am and what value do I bring to the world?

As you read this you'll notice or should notice the error in my thinking. It was based on what value or legacy that 'I' have or will eventually leave behind. The world idolizes the wealthy, actors, musicians, and athletes but ignores the homeless, the poor, the disabled and the weak. People like Steve Jobs, Elon Musk, Michael Jordan, Bill Gates etc. are all held up on a pedestal bestowed of an elevated value based on earthly standards. In hopes of answering the question "where does one's self-worth come from," I turned to the great philosopher Beyonce who quotes, "Your self-worth is determined by you. You don't have to depend on someone to tell you who you are." At this point the rich young ruler who came to


