Pastoral Pondering

PARTIAL BEFORE PERFECT

"But when the perfect comes, the partial will pass away." 1 Corinthians 13:10

I have been thinking about this piece of a verse from 1 Corinthians lately. It seems like I have spent a lot of my life trying to get it "just right." One would think that if we try hard enough, we can get really close to the real thing. But life is not like that. Something is terribly wrong. This world is not perfect; we seem to be living in "the partial."

Have you ever really thought about what this means? Living in the partial means we see as a dim reflection those things that are really true. We read and yet we miss the point. We argue and debate while standing on a stage of semi solid human understanding, like so much gelatin. There is perfect, and there is truth of this I am sure. What I am not so sure about is our brain's ability to contain the truth of God, even more so, our tongue's ability to relate it. Often, I found myself relaying my most recent God given insight (usually to my unfortunate wife) only to be met with blank stares and confusion. Doesn't she get it? It is like I am speaking in a foreign tongue. It seems so clear to me.

This year has been different, however. Instead of trying to find just the right book or reading plan we decided to read through a small piece of the Bible each day and summarize the chapter together in as few lines as possible. Our goal was not to get the absolute truth, or some never before seen nugget, but, as much as we could, just to read together and with the same mind come to a joint thought on what the passage meant in our lives.

Over the past three months we have summarized three books of the Bible, and it has been some of the most peaceful and glorious times we have ever had. Not searching for the only right answer. Not fighting over who had the right opinion. Just thinking and talking together about what Christ is showing both of us from our different perspectives.

I want to share with you what we have heard from 1 Corinthians this month: The message is simple. Be unified in Christ who is the wisdom and Power of God crucified for our sins. Folly to the world but a secret, hidden wisdom from God revealed only by the Spirit. Do not follow men, follow Him. The body will have fallen men, some will need to be removed but only with wisdom full of mercy and grace. Live in peace together as you are called. Not trying to make something of yourself and not creating a stumbling block for others. Live a disciplined life for the sake of the Gospel, avoiding idolatry and doing all for the glory of God. Submit to God's authority not for self-interest but for the interest of others. The Spirit has given different gifts to each of us to be used exclusively for the building up of the Body, but none of these gifts can work without Love. Love is what binds them together and it is what makes them profitable. Without love our gifts of wisdom, or prophecy or

teaching or anything are only so much noise and waste. In love use your gift solely for the sake of building up others in the Body and not for puffing up yourself. Above all remember the Gospel according to the scriptures, Christ died for your sins, was buried, and raised, seen by many witnesses and as Master over even death proved the resurrection and removed the fear of death. Therefore, just as we are all subject to death in the flesh because of Adam even so we are alive in the Spirit because of Christ, and this transforms our perishable mortal bodies to imperishable immortal bodies no longer subject to the sting of death resulting from the power of sin using a perfect law against our weak flesh. This releases us to abound with fruit in the work of the LORD and share this abundance in love with one another.

My point in all of this is not to claim some sort of wisdom or knowledge. In fact, it is quite the opposite. Most of you will read the above thoughts and think, "Well that is not quite right" or "I already know this." But the contents are not the point. Working together with one passion (which is really what one mind means) to see more of Jesus, is all that matters. Before, I was trying to get the perfect picture. We will not get that till we stand face to face with Jesus. Then the partial will disappear. In the meantime, start small. Read a bit, pray a bit, and meditate a bit. With those around you, do something that you can do every day. And do it with love and understanding. If it expands, then great. If not just be content listening each day to your Savior. Don't stress over it, soon enough you will be staring Perfection in the face


