Pastoral Pondering

ARE YOU GRAZING OR FEASTING ON HIS WORD?

My prayer is that your life is filled with time in the word. The Bible is clear, that we are not designed to live by bread alone. And when we try to live by bread alone, we become weak – perhaps not physically (though sometimes) – weak emotionally, spiritually, and we look less and less like our Savior.

My constant prayer is that the Lord would make us a people of His word: students of His word, those who delight in the word – not for *reading's* sake, but for Who the word tells us about – our Good Shepherd. Without Him, we are like sheep without a shepherd. No matter how our earthly pursuits are going, without Christ as our shepherd, we *are* ill-fed sheep without a shepherd.

In Mark chapter 6, Jesus makes this observation in verse 34, "when [Jesus] went ashore He saw a great crowd, and He had compassion on them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd." What does a crowd who are aimless sheep need? They need a shepherd to feed them. So, what does Jesus do to address their plight? The very next words recorded are, "And He began to teach them many things." His words are what we need. His words are what feed our aimless soul.

As this passage unfolds, we watch the disciples misunderstand the moment, when they insist that the crowd is not getting the food that they need. 'The people must be getting hungry!' They insist that Jesus "send them away" (verse 36), because "the hour is now late" (verse 35)! The disciples don't understand that THE Shepherd has come, and He will take care of their hunger (feeding is the definition of a good shepherd).

But they don't understand. The truth is, we are most satisfied when we remain near our shepherd – listening to Him - resting in Him - feeding on what He gives to us. Jesus knows what His sheep need – and so, Jesus feeds the 5,000. Unfortunately, we read the text like the disciples read the moment, and believe that the feeding took place when they passed out physical food. But this is to misunderstand the moment.

The *real* feeding of the 5000 took place *before* he broke the physical bread. All day they had been feasting upon the green grass of His words.

How do you approach time in His word? Does it feel like a hurdle to get past in order to get to the real needs of the day? As you take the time daily to get into the word, are you actually feasting – or are you, like the disciples, more interested

in what comes after your time with Jesus' words? Are you simply interested in the physical feeding of the 5000? The disciples (I don't blame them!) were thinking in purely earthly terms about the day. But they hadn't realized that the words Jesus had been sharing were satisfying the deepest longings of every soul who had been listening that day. So much so, that no one in the crowd left! No one had become 'hangry'!

Far from the crowd dwindling because of hungry families, the crowd was steadfast – eating the words of our Savior. They refused to leave – because they were being filled. He had been satisfying their deepest hunger.

Too often we get into the mindset of the disciples and want to rush through Jesus' words (our time in His word) so that we can get to the 'what' truly matters – which is clearly – 'What's for lunch?' Brothers and sisters, students of the word, put yourself back into the crowd – seeing and hearing for the first-time what Jesus is saying – and feast on His words.

And, if you are joining us reading through the M'Cheyne reading plan (grab a copy in the entry way and jump in – please!), as you read Numbers, Psalms, Song of Songs, and Hebrews (the four passages we are currently working through), let these words be eaten to satisfy the deepest needs you have. Don't rush through.

Don't worry, after Jesus feeds your soul, Christ is there to minister to our physical needs as well – as He did even on that day. After all, "if God so clothes the grass of the field, which today is alive and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will He not much more clothe you, O you of little faith? Therefore do not be anxious, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?'" (Matthew 6:30-31).

Feast on His word.


