THE HIDDEN TREASURE

"The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field, which a man found and covered up. Then in his joy he goes and sells all that he has and buys that field." (Matthew 13:44, ESV)

Can you imagine the excitement this man had in finding that treasure? It was worth more than everything he owned. He sold all he owned in order to buy the field to gain it's treasure.

Treasure is something that inspires people. We enjoy books and movies about treasures that people eagerly seek. Some treasures are gotten through great effort, but some are gotten illegally.

As believers in the Lord Jesus Christ, we have a great treasure—many treasures, actually. I would like to focus on one that we possess but, sadly, we often take for granted. Responding to the treasure that way suggests we do not realize its great value.

Though this is not the primary meaning of the verse, the word of God itself is a treasure of unfathomable value. What believer would disagree with that? But how many times have we read from God's word and walked away empty, unchanged, and unimpressed? It's almost as if we had not read it at all. I hate to confess that this happens far more often than I would like to admit. Of course, I make my daily "through the Bible" reading an exception because the purpose of re-reading seven chapters a day is largely to refresh my memory of the basic content. But is that a valid exception to make?

Reading the Bible should impact us.

I made that statement a standalone paragraph to make it stand out. Even reading "just for content" should be done with a view to allowing the Holy Spirit to speak to us. Sometimes that "speaking" is simply to draw us to return to the passage in order to dig in more deeply. It is in that deeper digging that the Holy Spirit breathes life into our reading.

The idea of deeper digging should bring us back to the verse. How did the man find the treasure? There was no sign, no map, no metal detector, and nothing to see. In order to find, the man had to be looking for... He did not even know what he was looking for. In fact, he did not even know he was looking for something. He was just there. But why was he there? Until he found the treasure, even he had no clue.

Let me stretch the imagery a bit and suggest that the man was there because *the Lord brought him there to find the treasure*. That reminds me of my routine, often fruitless, daily reading. I do not know what I am looking for until I find it. I am there reading because the Lord brought me there. He may have something for me to find, but He may not—at least for that particular day. Not finding anything exciting on most days is what makes the *finding* exciting, hoped for, and fulfilling. That is what makes coming back faithfully every day worthwhile.

Keep reading. Keep waiting for the Lord to show you what He wants you to find. Ask Him to open your eyes. When you find what He wants you to find, realize that it is a treasure He put there for you to find. And rejoice. And come back the next day for more.

Remember: in order to find the treasure, you must be "in the field." Keep going there and there will be days when the treasure will surprise you.


