#### PASTORAL PONDERING

#### Discontentment

Have you ever been to a store that claims, "If we don't have it you don't need it?" I was recently shopping at Mills Fleet Farm, where customers have been known to say those words. The funny thing was I couldn't find what I needed. What they are really saying is that "We have the main things that most people need when they go to a store," but of course they can't have everything. I was looking to find wheel bearings to match a really old boat trailer. They had wheel bearings but not the size I needed. I'd have to go to a parts store for that. I was a bit frustrated that they didn't have what I needed.

Living in a consumer-minded society, sometimes we can approach our local churches this way. We seek out churches that offer what we are looking for: a one-stop shop for all our needs. Or maybe we are guided by something specific (such as a style of music, youth program, a mom's group, people our age, etc.) We may find ourselves wishing that there was more, or we might be frustrated or let down or even feel forgotten if something isn't available for "me." We may be inclined to look around for a church that at least has that one specific thing. However, many times that other church may have that one specific thing but lack the most important things; things like Christ-centered and faithful teaching, godly leadership, sharing the banner of Christ alone, true fellowship with one another and with God, and a body of believers committed to walking with one another in love and pursuing Christ with arms linked together.

Ultimately, we find all needs met in Christ. In Him we lack nothing (Psalm 23); He alone is our joy and satisfaction (Romans 15:13), His Word is sufficient for all things (2 Peter 1:3); He is the solution (Ephesians 2:4-10). Do you believe that? Or are you tempted to think you need more, or that what another church offers might have the solution? Has the grass ever really been greener on the other side? If we search for a solution to our needs beyond Christ alone, we will be found to be greatly unsatisfied again.

I'm not seeking to defend New Life in anyway, but rather, I desire to counsel our hearts that tend to be greatly affected by our consumer-minded society where we focus on how a church can serve us and fill our needs rather than how we can serve <u>as the church</u> and meet needs. We can forget that the solution to our needs is not the building, not the programs, not the leadership, not worship style, but JESUS. If the most important things are taking place, you're not lacking what you really need. In a consumer mindset we forget that it's really <u>not</u> all about "me."

Rather, we are all members of one body mutually serving one another, striving to build each other up into maturity in Christ (Ephesians 4). If you're feeling discontent or disconnected where you are, consider how you might be a part of filling a need in the body.

New Life, like many other small-town churches, doesn't have every bell and whistle, but by God's grace we see the most important things taking place here week after week. If something specific is lacking, maybe that's a ministry you can start!

Here are a few examples of "specific things" that are good things but may not be available and how you could serve. "There really isn't something for young moms." Host regular play dates with other young moms in your home and encourage one another in your walk with the Lord and in parenting.

"There aren't any Bible studies at a time that works with my schedule." Start one. There are great resources in the resource center!

"There is nothing for the youth." Take initiative and invite them to your house for a campfire.

To wrap up my Fleet Farm story, they actually did have what I needed, but I would have to wait until it shipped to the store. I was impatient and wanted something now. Maybe that "something" that you feel is missing requires patience or maybe there's a way to combat that discontentment by serving, or maybe today you just need that gentle reminder that Christ is your all in all and you are loved by Him. And as always, your elders are here to hear your thoughts and come alongside you as you seek to serve the body.
