#### **PASTORAL PONDERING**

#### SHIMON'S STORY

"Now the men who were holding Jesus in custody were mocking him as they beat him. They also blindfolded him and kept asking him, 'Prophesy! Who is it that struck you?' And they said many other things against him, blaspheming him." [Luke 22:63-65 ESV]

My name is Shimon. I was a member of the security force at the high priest's house in Jerusalem. The high priest (we called him "the HP") didn't really need a security force, but he wanted to feel safe. The guys on the force used to laugh and say, "It makes the old man feel important."

There was this teacher who had been around for about three years. He was from Galilee, but periodically he would show up in Jerusalem. His name was Jesus, and he was very popular among the common people. There were stories that he healed many people. If Jesus hadn't been so popular, he would have been ignored completely by the higher-ups. But he was popular. Very popular. So the HP wanted to do away with him. Most of the security force thought he was jealous of Jesus, but frankly, I think he actually feared him. Something was going to happen. I was sure of it.

One night while I was on duty, something happened that our commander called "The Big Break." Some days before, one of the disciples of Jesus had come to the council and offered to find an opportunity when they would be able to arrest Jesus. Tonight, the betrayer had informed the HP that Jesus and his disciples would be in a garden just outside Jerusalem. There would be no crowd, so an arrest would be easy. Most of the security force left for the garden.

We found Jesus and his disciples. Most of the disciples were asleep, so it was easy to control them. One of them woke up and began wielding a sword. I heard that he had cut off the ear of a servant of the HP, but it was dark and in the flickering light of our torches it was hard to tell what was going on. When I looked at the servant's ear and protested that it was perfectly healthy and attached to his head, another member of the security force said he saw Jesus heal the detached ear. I'm not sure what actually happened.

We tied Jesus' hands so he couldn't resist, and we brought him to the HP's house. Jesus' faithful disciples ran for the hills, so to speak. Once back at our headquarters, our commander told us to "have a little fun" with the prisoner. Since he was said to be a prophet, someone suggested we should challenge him to

demonstrate his prophetic gift. We blindfolded him and began to hit him and demand that he identify who did it. He never said a word, and I began to have second thoughts about our "fun." But the enthusiasm of my security force friends got the best of me, and I entered in. I wound up and hit Jesus as hard as I could right on the cheek. His head jerked back, and I knew it really hurt. But then he broke his silence said something that shocked me. He said, "You are Shimon, son of Hilkiah, son of Mathias." I suddenly felt very weak. I thought I was going to collapse to the floor. I'm sure my face went pale. How could he know it was me? How could he know my name? How could he know the names of my father and grandfather? I was struggling to figure out what was going on.

I finally found the strength to cry out. "Stop! This man is innocent." I turned to Jesus and said, "Lord, you know all things. You know I'm a sinner. Please forgive me." Jesus said nothing. He simply looked at me and smiled. I burst into tears.

Of course, it didn't happen like that, but a little fiction can lead us to think. That's my desire with this Pastoral Pondering. As my daily Bible reading brought me to this passage recently, I wondered what would have happened if Jesus had responded to the taunts by identifying his attackers. This story is the result.

Do we think we could do something that Jesus would not know about? We would never actually hit him like those men did. Or would we? We do things that equally offend his righteousness and holiness. Why do we ignore those "little sins?" As believers our hearts have been changed, leading us to have a desire to please our wonderful Lord. Let's seek to live faithfully to that standard.
