# For God So Loved The World

"For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal live. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him." ~John 3:16-17

With the new NFL season starting we will again be seeing the popular John 3:16 signs in the stands. This is the most popular Bible verse for obvious reasons and is probably the first verse committed to memory for most of us. This verse and the Lord's Prayer are recited so often that we take the words for granted and often don't spend time actually contemplating their meaning and how they pertain towards our own lives.

Sometimes it takes a trial or crisis to redirect our focus back towards God. This is often seen throughout the Psalms and it's true in my own life. Recently, our family life was going along as usual with summer weekend getaways and raising grandchildren when, suddenly, our life was changed in what seemed like a moment. Many of you know that our grandson, Jayden, has lived with us since his birth and therefore our relationship is more like a parent-child relationship. He has been my fishing buddy and an integral part of my daily life.

In late July, Cory had noted that Jayden was always hungry and thirsty with frequent urination. She told me this and, as a doc, I knew what this meant but tried to deny the obvious, knowing what this would mean. We finally checked his glucose and found his blood sugar to be over 500. Normal is generally around 100. I tried to hide my heartbreak but he saw my tears and asked, "Am I going to die?' I responded by saying no. I knew that we'd need to head to Children's Hospital for further testing. As we were driving there - which seemed to take forever - all I could contemplate was the lifechanging events we would be facing. As a doc, I have treated people with diabetes and all that comes with it for years, but when it hits your own family it's heartbreaking.

We got to Children's ER and eventually got escorted back to a room where we would be encamped for 18 hours awaiting a hospital bed. As the nurses came in to draw blood and start IVs my heartache continued as I watched Jayden trying to remain brave in the midst of this crisis. There were funny moments but most of it from Jayden's perspective was related to the hourly vital signs, blood draws and continued IV dripping and monitors beeping. The ER which was an area I was comfortable with as a doc now seemed so foreign with my loved one there.

Through the night after several insulin injections, Jayden's blood sugars were getting closer to normal. It was in the middle of the night that Jayden asked the question which everyone eventually asks - "why me?" I told him that God is in control and that answer may not be obvious for a while but He has a plan. I also told him that I would, in a heartbeat, trade places with him if it were possible.

We finally made it up to the hospital floor, and while Jayden finally fell asleep out of exhaustion it became clear to me that true love is the driving force for giving up one's life for another. I would resoundingly do that for any of my family members but the question is would I do it for a stranger or, even worse, someone who persecuted me? The answer is absolutely not.

I was suddenly in a personal way confronted with the fact that Jesus took the place not just for me or the people who loved him like I would do for Jayden, but he died for ALL including the very people who hated him. That's mind blowing. I was also aware once again that, given all the trials Jayden will face battling his diabetes including the daily insulin injections and blood tests, this earthly life is short and that Jesus died so that we can have eternal life free of earthly diseases like cancers, depression, anxiety, diabetes and heart disease - which sounds awesome - but the ultimate reward will be an eternity with Jesus our Lord and Savior. God is good. And thank you to all who know Jayden and have been praying for him and us. Your prayers are invaluable!
