PASTORAL PONDERING

Corona

I was thinking about this pondering and trying to decide what things as of late have occupied my consciousness. As I tried to think about pertinent spirit filled topics and pay attention to my regular scripture reading, I was continually interrupted by one chain of thoughts. As much as I have recently tried to forget it, the topic kept coming back to me in various forms. Hard as I would try to "fix my mind on things above" this intrusive thought continued. Why was I dwelling on this "non-spiritual" thought? So, in the end I have decided to write this pondering on this "non-spiritual" topic. *How to handle the Corona (CoVid-19) virus.*

Unless you have been hiding under a rock for the last couple of months, you have probably heard a ton of "information" about this particular Pandemic. It seems like there is often one of two responses to this. Bury your head in the sand or run wild with your hair on fire. What is the Christian's response to our current predicament? What impact should this have on us?
